


#### 1.000 BOOKS BEFORE KINDERGARTEN

## **Winter Reading Program**



Responsibilities include customer service, circulation services and technology assistance. Dear Readers, Supporters and Friends,

Have you ever wondered what happened to a favorite read from so long ago? Or wanted to read a book that the library doesn't carry? Because of limited resources a local public library can only have so many books and materials. Where can it be found if not in our library? The good news is that Iowa libraries are networked with libraries across Iowa and the United States.

Libraries, like the Orange City Public Library, who participate in resource sharing do so with a service called interlibrary loan. Requests for materials (books, DVDs, music cds, recorded books, and even magazine articles) can be placed in your library account online, over the phone or in person at the library. Best part – we do all the research to locate the item so you don't have to!

Materials are loaned from other Iowa libraries and transported by courier through a delivery system called IA Shares (articles may be emailed). This courier service is just over 1 year in its service history and has allowed the Orange City Public Library to remove fees for in-state interlibrary loan requests. Sometimes materials can't be located in Iowa. If that is the case, out of state libraries may be consulted which, upon approval by the requester (you), would require a \$3.00 mailing fee. Not a bad price for something hard to get, at least in my estimation.
