

Getting started with Bridges or Libby:


1. Go to bridges.overdrive.com and select "Sign in" or install the Libby app from your device's app store.

2. Search for the Orange City Public Library.

3. Enter your 13-digit library card number (no letter) and 7-digit phone number (or 10-digit if not 712).

4. Browse or search for materials under the "Library"
