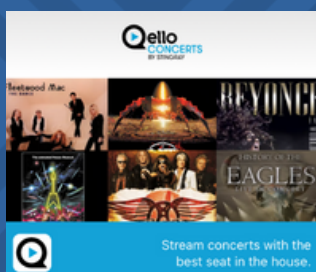
FEATURED THIS MONTH: LIBBY

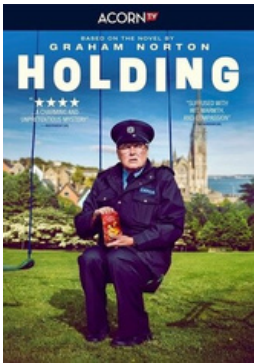
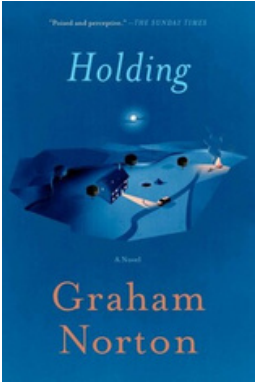

BOOK REVIEW:

"Holding" by Graham Norton

This is the second Graham Norton book I (Gail) have read, and my fondness for his writing continues. His stories are like comfort food, set in small Irish villages and filled with characters we come to know well. "Holding" is a gentle read, its mystery unfolding at the hands of Sergeant P.J. Collins, the sole officer of Duneen, whose kind manner belies his deep insecurities. The story is lovely in the way that ordinary stories about ordinary people can be, perhaps because we become, for a short time, part of a community of people whose lives resonate with our own.
