



BOOK REVIEW:

"The Girl Who Fell Beneath the Sea" by Axie Oh, reviewed by Anna

If, like me, you enjoy reading young adult fantasy novels with strong female leads and sweeping mythology, then you might enjoy The Girl Who Fell Beneath the Sea, which is a retelling of the classic Korean folktale The Tale of Shim Cheong. The Sea God is supposed to protect the people, but for generations, they have felt abandoned as storms, floods, and wars destroy their land and their villages. Each year, a beautiful maiden is thrown into the sea as a sacrifice, in hopes of appeasing the Sea God with a bride. The story follows Mina after she throws



herself into the sea to save the life of her brother and his love, Shim Cheong. Mina enters the Spirit Realm, where she encounters spirits, gods, and demons, and discovers that the Sea God appears to be caught in an enchanted sleep. The story is filled with unexpected twists, as Mina tries to break the Sea God out of his enchanted sleep and save her people. She finds allies along the way, including a mysterious young man named Shin, as well as assassins who want to stop her from succeeding. The charming characters and fast-paced plot will sweep you along as you learn about the importance of passing culture and traditions down through generations and making personal sacrifices for the good of those you hold dear.
